
## CHURCHILL - WHERE POLAR BEARS ROAM

Journey to Churchill, Manitoba, a remote frontier town known as the Polar Bear Capital of the World, and immerse yourself in one of nature's most extraordinary spectacles.

Each year, throughout October and November, hundreds of polar bears migrate back to Churchill awaiting the return of the first sea ice on Hudson Bay. This remarkable natural phenomenon creates unparalleled opportunities to observe wild polar bears in their natural habitat – an experience available nowhere else with such reliability and accessibility. Polar bear encounters unfold aboard specially designed Tundra Buggies – elevated, all-terrain vehicles engineered to traverse the harsh subarctic landscape while ensuring both safety and optimal wildlife viewing.

"Wildlife and weather are unpredictable which means we can never guarantee wildlife sightings. However, we have an excellent track record and our team of Tundra Buggy drivers work together in the Churchill Wildlife Management Area to ensure our guests have the best viewing opportunities possible. ## October 2026 Saturday 10 Auckland -Vancouver D

An evening departure on Air New Zealand. Cross the dateline with an early evening arrival in Vancouver and transfer to our central hotel. Welcome Dinner tonight.

#### Sunday 11 Vancouver B

After breakfast, a morning Vancouver city tour is included with the afternoon free to explore and enjoy the city.

#### Tuesday 13 Winnipeg - Train B D

Meet for breakfast before checking in at the train station for an early afternoon departure to Churchill. Overnight on the train. For the next two days travel through three different biospheres including the prairie grasslands, boreal forest of the Canadian Shield, and last but not least the tundra of northern Manitoha.

#### Wednesday 14 Train B L D

Full day on board the train with a chance to stretch your legs in Thompson, a major stop on the route. Overnight on the train.

#### **Thursday 15 Churchill** B L D

Enjoy an early-morning breakfast on board before finally arriving in Churchill. Today enjoy a guided bus tour including the Polar Bear Holding Facility and Itsanitaq Museum, home to one of the most extensive collections of Inuit art in the world, before lunch at a local restaurant. Free time this afternoon, before dinner at a local restaurant. The evening can be spent exploring Churchill's authentic shops, enjoying a beverage at the local pub or relaxing at the hotel.





#### Friday 16 Tundra Buggy Wildlife Excursion B L D

Following an early morning breakfast, depart for your first full-day Tundra Buggy adventure exploring the Churchill Wildlife Management Area on a network of established trails in search of polar bears, arctic fox, ptarmigan and other sub-arctic wildlife. Lunch and refreshments will be served on board. Return to Churchill for dinner at a local restaurant before finishing the day with a presentation from a local resident on the culture, history, wildlife and lifestyle of the Churchill area.

Saturday 17 Dog Sledding and local sightseeing  $\ B \ L \ D$ 

This morning travel beyond the town limits to Churchill's boreal forest for a thrilling dog sled excursion. Hosted by a local Churchill resident and dog

sledding expert - learn about the history associated with dog sledding and the Métis culture before heading off on a custom-built sled for a mile-long ride behind a strong team of huskies. Enjoy lunch back in town before making a stop at the Parks Canada Visitor Centre, located in Churchill's historic train station, where you will step back in time during an interpretive program about Churchill's history. Dinner at a local restaurant this evening and the chance to visit the Polar BearsInternational House to learn more about polar bear research and climate change.

## Sunday 18 Tundra Buggy – flight to Winnipeg B L D

After breakfast transfer to the Tundra Buggy dock for a second and final fullday adventure. On board, a Polar Bears International species expert will provide an in-depth discussion on polar bears and their habitat. After a day of exploring the tundra, bid farewell to Churchill and transfer to the airport for an evening flight back to Winnipeg. A light meal will be served. Upon arrival in Winnipeg overnight at Winnipeg's international airport.


## Monday 19 Winnipeg - Vancouver - Auckland B

#### Climate

Throughout polar bear season during October and November, Churchill's temperatures tend to be very cold, ranging from -16°C to 7°C. Our time on the tundra is in heated Tundra Buggy vehicles, but with windows being lowered for photography, you should expect interior temperatures to range from -1°C to 16°C and will want wear sufficient layers to remain comfortable. As with any location, temperatures in Churchill can vary widely, the streets and sidewalks in Churchill can become very slippery with layers of ice and snow.
